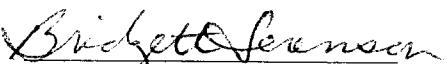

APPROVE CONTRACT AWARD, AND FEDERAL FUNDS FOR SAULT TRIBE BROADBAND CONSULTANT PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, as amended; and

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WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians desires to improve the access, reliability, and affordability of internet services for Sault Tribe Membership and Sault Tribe facilities by applying for various Broadband Grants; and

WHEREAS, the primary grant NTIA (Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects) has a funding range (but not limited to) between \$1,000,000 and \$50,000,000 per grantee; and

WHEREAS, Reimbursement of reasonable costs associated with preparing the grant application shall not exceed five (5) percent of the award; and

WHEREAS, the complexity of the 7-County Broadband Project, grant applications, and project management requires specialized knowledge as defined in the Broadband RFP; and

WHEREAS, bids were solicited for this work, and the Sault Tribe Broadband workgroup has reviewed the Purchasing Department's recommendation and has performed the required bid analysis (taking into account both bid price and bid quality); and

WHEREAS, the Sault Tribe Workgroup recommends that the Tribe approve an amount not to exceed \$200,000 for this purpose.

FOR THE ESCANABA TRIBAL COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER**



WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians has committed to support and run the Escanaba Tribal Community Health Center in Escanaba, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, currently there is a lease between the Tribe, as Lessee and U.P. Property Management LLC (formally known as Penstar, Inc.) as the Lessor, to permit the Tribe the usage of 1,271 square feet of Penstar's office building located at 1401 North 26th Street, Escanaba, Michigan, for purposes of running the Health Center; and

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WHEREAS, the lease is about to expire and the Tribe feels it is in their best interest to renew the Lease for another year, under the same terms and conditions with a slight increase in rental amount, to continue the Health Center services; and

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WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Tribe that the following services continue to be offered at the Health Center in the Escanaba property:

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- * Community Health Program Services.
- * Monthly Telemedicine Clinics.
- * Health fairs and wellness gatherings-health education services.
- * Confidential meeting space for Tribal Liaison with Tribal members.
- * Confidential meeting space for ACFS, Behavioral Health and Nutrition Program services with Tribal members.

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WHEREAS, the yearly rent on the property is \$13,080.00 for the one year Lease renewal and the annual CPI-U increase will be waived to the end of the term with this agreement; and

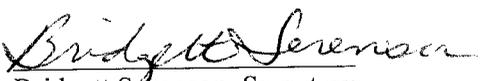

AUTHORIZATION TO SET UP NADP SITE

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians wishes to assert its sovereignty over the air, lands, and waters of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Department has obtained scientific equipment to measure atmospheric deposition of contaminants through the National Atmospheric Deposition Program, and

WHEREAS, operating NADP equipment will provide information regarding acid precipitation parameters, which are also asthma triggers, and associated with burning of fossil fuels, steelmaking, and other industrial activity; and

WHEREAS, Native American children suffer from asthma at rates significantly higher than other children do; and

WHEREAS the scientific requirements for set up and operation of this equipment are stringent and require specific setbacks from roads, buildings, tree canopy, construction, and other clearances; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Department has examined Sault Tribe lands to determine whether a suitable site could be found, and reviewed their findings and recommended location with the Land and Space Committee, the Legal Department, and the EDC, and no concerns were expressed regarding the use of the recommended location; and

WHEREAS, the land at the corner of Gardenville Road and Three Mile Road, on the parcel where the conservation easement for wetland mitigation for Wal-Mart and Meijer stores is located, which was conveyed to the Tribe by the City of Sault Ste. Marie, meets all requirements for an NADP site and is the site recommended by the Environmental Department; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Department has obtained approval from EPA program managers to retain former grant funds under a no-cost extension allowing the equipment platform to be moved and set up at the Gardenville Road location and powered with solar panels;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians does hereby, as follows:

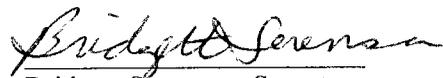

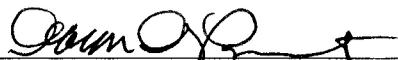

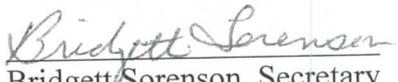

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WHEREAS, on October 29, 2020, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service published the Final Wolf Delisting Rule removing gray wolves from the protections of the Endangered Species Act; and

WHEREAS, in January 2021, three sets of plaintiffs filed lawsuits challenging the gray wolf delisting decision and seeking to nullify the delisting rule; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is of the opinion that joining an amicus brief in these three consolidated cases will serve to advance the Tribe's position and interests in the matter of the delisting of gray wolves.

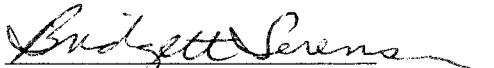
