Hear Billy's inspirational story, the only American ever to win gold in the Olympic 10k event.

Billy Mills was the inspiration for the movie "Running Brave," starring Robbie Benson, the story of Mills' life on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation and the obstacles he overcame to become an Olympic champion. At the 1964 Olympics, Mills came from behind to win the gold medal in the 10k race, setting a world record of 28 minutes, 24.4 seconds.

In 2014, Mills celebrated the 50th anniversary of his gold medal win by founding Dreamstarter, a grant program to jump start the dreams of Native youth.
