Keynote Speaker
Ira Chasnoff, MD



Ira J. Chasnoff, M.D., an award-winning author, researcher and lecturer, is president of NTI Upstream and a Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at the University of Illinois

College of Medicine in Chicago. He is one of the nation's leading researchers in the field of child development and the effects of maternal alcohol and drug use on the newborn infant and child. His research projects include a study of the long-term cognitive, behavioral and educational developmental effects of prenatal exposure to alcohol, cocaine, and other drugs; strategies for screening pregnant women for substance use; the effects on birth outcomes of prenatal treatment and counseling for pregnant drug abusers; and the effectiveness of both outpatient and residential treatment programs for pregnant drug abusers. Dr. Chasnoff's most recent work focuses on community approaches to the integration of behavioral health services into primary health care for women and children and the occurrence of co-occurring mental health disorders in children who have been exposed to alcohol, methamphetamine, cocaine and other drugs.

Mark Sloane, DO, Medical Director of the Children's Trauma Assessment Center (CTAC) at Western Michigan University, is a board-certified pediatrician with specialized advanced fellowship training in

adolescent behavioral medicine. He has more than 34 years clinical pediatric experience, and is owner of the Center for Behavioral Pediatrics in Kalamazoo. Sloane is considered an expert in the diagnosis and treatment of learning, attention and behavioral disorders in traumatized and prenatally-exposed children and adolescents. He is a founding member of CTAC's transdisciplinary team and has clinical experience in the medication treatment of more than 1,200 traumatized and prenatally-exposed children and adolescents evaluated at CTAC.

George M Nidiffer, M.D., is a Pediatric Medicine Specialist in Marquette, Michigan. He graduated with honors from Loyola University Of Chicago, Stritch School Of Medicine in 1966.
