WHEREAS, it is extremely important to ensure that our streams, minor tributaries, wetlands, and small water bodies remain protected.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors hereby announces and pledges its supports for the Clean Water Authority Restoration Act; an act intended to reverse recent Supreme Court precedents and to restore the jurisdiction of the United States Environmental Protection Agency to regulate and control the minor waterways and wetlands of the United States.

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that each member of the Board of Directors is able to provide adequate representation to their constituents, the Board has been granted the use of cellular phones and tribal computers; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Board of Directors must be ensured security and privacy in their dealings with their constituents and other Board Members; and

WHEREAS, although there is a need for Board Member privacy, there is also a need to ensure that Board Member's records are subject to scrutiny in some limited circumstances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that no person, Board Member, or employee of the Tribe, absent a court order, shall access or attempt to access the cell phone, computer, e-mail, or other electronic records of any Member of the Board of Directors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any person or employee that does access the cell phone, computer, e-mail, or other electronic records of any Member of the Board of Directors shall be immediately terminated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any elected official or Board Member that does access the cell phone, computer, e-mail, or other electronic records of any member of the Board of Directors will be punished by a fine of \$5,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors as a whole may authorize disclosure of any records otherwise confidential under this Resolution provided that a Positive Majority of the Members in open session votes to investigate the records and such decision is enacted as a Resolution of the Board.
