RESOLUTION NO: 3006-98 AMENDMENT TO TRIBAL CODE CHAPTER 42: GAMING ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 467 et seq; and

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Economic Development Commission WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is authorized by the Constitution to develop the Tribal Code and amend it from time to time as the Board of Directors deems necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined to amend Chapter 42, section 42.801, of the Tribal Code, Gaming Ordinance, to specifically identify the locations where the Board of Directors has authorized the conduct of Class II and Class III gaming.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby amends the Tribal Code Chapter 42, Garning Ordinance, S. 42.801 to add a subsection 3 which specifically identifies the locations where the Board of Directors has authorized the conduct of Class II and Class III garning.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that those locations are the following cities and towns in Michigan: in Sault Ste. Marie, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1984; in St. Ignace, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983 and 2000; in Manistique, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983; in Christmas, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983; and in Hessel, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1982.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the amendment to the Tribal Code Chapter 42, Gaming Ordinance, S.42.801, shall be as substantially set forth in the document attached hereto entitled, Amendment to Tribal Code, Chapter 42: Gaming Ordinance.

Amendment to Tribal Code, Chapter 42: Gaming Ordinance

42.801 Permitted Activity.

Class II and III gaming conducted in conformity with this Chapter is permitted at tribally owned licensed gaming establishments located on the following lands:

- (1) Indian land acquired by the Secretary of the Interior in trust on or before October 17, 1988; or
- (2) land which is acquired by the Secretary of the Interior in trust for the benefit of the Tribe after October 17, 1988 and which:
 - (a) is located within or contiguous to the boundaries of the reservation as they existed on October 17, 1988; or
 - (b) has been authorized for a gaming establishment by the Secretary of the Interior under 25 USC ' 2719(b)(1) or meets the requirements of 25 USC ' 2719(b)(2); or

(3) at the following locations within Michigan:

- (a) Sault Ste. Marie, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1984;
- (b) St. Ignace, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983 and in 2000;
 - (c) Manistique, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983;
 - (d) Christmas, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1983; and
 - (e) Hessel, on lands taken into trust for the Tribe=s benefit in 1982.

Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians' Board of Directors hereby directs the legal department to rescind the current offer to purchase real estate in Escanaba, Michigan, with all efforts given to limiting the amount of damages that must be paid to the seller for rescinding the offer to purchase.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby allocates out of the revenue from the sale of the Glen's Building to the legal department such money as is necessary to pay any damages to the seller of the Escanaba property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby rescinds all previous budgetary earmarks for this revenue and re-allocates the remaining revenue from the sale of the old Glen's building to funding the current budget shortfall in the Contract Health Services instead.
