Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Sorenson, supported by Director Freiheit, to suspend the rules and add Key Employee to the agenda.

Roll Call Vote: Motion denied with Directors Hollowell, Freiheit, Massaway, Gravelle, Lowes, Causley, McKerchie, Sorenson approving; Directors Morrow, Chase, Matson, Hoffman opposing. The vote needed a vote of 9 to be approved.

Moved by Director Causley, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-85, Continuing Funding Authority for Fiscal Year 2023 April to March.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby approves the FY 2022 budget modification for OVC Tribal Victim Services Set Aside to decrease Department of Justice Federal Revenue monies \$73,289.54. This budget modification will change the personnel sheet and reallocate expenses. No effect on Tribal Support.

Moved by Director Massaway, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-88, ACFS OVC Tribal Victim Services Set Aside CC 12071 FY 2022 Budget Modification.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby approves the FY 2022 budget modification for OVC Tribal Victim Services Set Aside to increase Department of Justice Federal Revenue monies \$17,137.87. This budget modification will change the personnel and reallocate expenses. No effect on Tribal Support.

Moved by Director Hoffman, supported by Director Massaway, to approve Res. 2022-89, Economic Development (EDC) FY 2022 Budget Modification.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby approves the FY 2022 budget modification to EDC for a decrease in Tribal Support of \$483,307.60 and an increase in Other Revenue of \$537,209.45.

Moved by Director Sorenson, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-90, Authorizing Construction Management Services Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors, authorizes a sole source award to Binesi Construction, LLC to provide Construction Management Services to the Sault Tribe, as negotiated between the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians' CFO and Binesi Contracting, LLC.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors authorizes its Tribal Chairperson, or his designee, to execute any documentation to effectuate the negotiated agreement(s).

Moved by Director Causley, supported by Director Sorenson, to approve Res. 2022-91, Sault Tribe Corporate Charter Board Appointment Approval.

RESOLVED, pursuant to Article VI, section 6.6 of the Sault Tribe Corporate Charter, the following individuals are hereby appointed to the Corporate Board of Directors of Sault Tribe Incorporated, to serve terms as specified below; replacing the vacant seat of Scott LaVictor. Rod Blanchard - for a term expiring June 30, 2023.

Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Causley, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-92, Trust Land Lease Cancellation – Captain, B. 2300 Shawano Drive Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby authorized its Tribal Chairperson and Treasurer, to execute this lease cancellation, and land being described as:

A parcel of land located in the Fractional Northwest 1/4, Section 16, Township 47 North, Range 1 East, City of Sault Ste. Marie, Chippewa County, Michigan more particularly described as commencing at the Northwest corner

Moved by Director Causley, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-93, Trust Land Lease Captain, J. 2300 Shawano Drive Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby authorized its Tribal Chairperson and Treasurer, to execute a lease to the land located at 2300 Shawano Drive, Sault Ste. Marie, MI to Joshua J. Captain and land being described as:

A parcel of land located in the Fractional Northwest 1/4, Section 16, Township 47 North, Range 1 East, City of Sault Ste. Moved by Director Gravelle, supported by Director Hoffman, to approve Res. 2022-94, Authorization to Negotiate – Sault Ste. Marie, MI Property Acquisition A.B. Wilgus Lots.

RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors authorizes the Sault Tribe EDC Executive Director or his designee, to negotiate the purchase of the property TIN: 051-815-001-00 and 051-816-011-00, not to exceed the agreed upon terms approved by the Board of Directors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon successful negotiations, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Director authorizes the Tribal Chairperson or his designee, to sign any and all documentation to complete the purchase of the property using funds as determined by the CFO.

Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Gravelle, supported by Director Hollowell, to approve Res. 2022-95, U.S. Department of the Treasury FY 2021 Emergency Rental Assistance Program Policy Amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Sault Tribe Board of Directors approves the FY 2021 Emergency Rental Assistance Program Policy, as presented.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, due to the frequently updated Treasury guidance on implementation requirements of the Emergency Rental Assistance Program, the Sault Tribe Board of Directors hereby delegates to the STHA the authority to revise the Emergency Rental Assistance Program Policy as necessary to carry out the program and maintain compliance with federal requirements. Revisions shall be reviewed and approved by the Grants Sub Committee Chairperson of the Executive Task Force prior to implementation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Sault Tribe Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Emergency Rental Assistance Program eligibility to all enrolled members of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians residing within the United States who qualify for the program.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors and Sault Tribe Housing Commission do agree to follow the approved U.S. Department of Treasury regulations, terms and conditions of the Emergency Rental Assistance program.

Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Hoffman, supported by Director Morrow, to approve Res. 2022-96, Opposition to Senate Bill 251.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors finds that State of Michigan Senate Bill 251 is directly adverse to the treaty fishing rights and interests of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians and the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians formally opposes Senate Bill 251.

Motion carried unanimously.

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Moved by Director Morrow, supported by Director Chase, to approve Res. 2022-97, Authorization to Negotiate 5722 W US 2 Manistique Property Acquisition.

RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby authorizes the Sault Tribe EDC Executive Director or his designee, to negotiate the purchase of the property TIN: 005-003-027-00, not to exceed the agreed upon terms approved by the Board of Directors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon successful negotiations, the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairperson or his designee, to sign any and all documentation. to complete the purchase of the property using funds as determined by the CFO.

Roll Call Vote: Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Causley, supported by Director Lowes, to accept the resignation of Chloe Kannan from the Election Committee and declare the seat vacant.

Motion carried unanimously.

Moved by Director Hoffman, supported by Director Sorenson, to table the request to transfer a fishing license.

Motion carried with Directors Hoffman, Morrow, McKerchie, Causley, Freiheit, Massaway, Chase, Sorenson, Lowes, Gravelle approving; Directors Matson, Hollowell opposing.
