§71.809 Breaking and Entering

Offense: A person commits the offense of Breaking and Entering if:

He breaks and enters or enters without breaking any:

dwelling, house, tent, hotel, office, store, shop, warehouse, barn, granary, factory or other building, boat, ship, railroad car or structure used or kept for public or private use, or any private apartment therein, or any cottage, clubhouse, boat house, hunting or fishing lodge, garage or the out-buildings belonging thereto, any ice shanty with a value of \$100.00 or more, or any other structure

Without first obtaining permission to enter from the person having immediate control and/or ownership thereof.

Comment. For the purpose of this section, it does not matter whether or not the building or other structure listed in subsection (1)(a)(i) is occupied or unoccupied.

Sentence. A person convicted of Breaking and Entering may be sentenced to imprisonment for a period of up to six (6) months, or a fine not to exceed five thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or both.

If there building or other structure listed in subsection (1)(a)(i) is damaged in the process of breaking and entering, the offender may be sentenced to pay restitution for the damage.

#### AMENDING CHAPTER 71 CRIMINAL OFFENSES: SUBCHAPTER VII: OFFENSES AGAINST THE PERSON §71.716 THREATENING TO COMMIT VIOLENCE WITH FIREARM, EXPLOSIVE, OR OTHER DANGEROUS WEAPON AGAINST STUDENTS OR EMPLOYEES ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby amends Tribal Code Chapter 71: Criminal Offenses as follows:

§71.716 Threatening to commit violence with firearm, explosive, or other dangerous weapon against students or employees on school property.

Offense: A person who verbally, through the use of an electronic device or system, or through other means intentionally threatens to use a firearm, explosive, or other dangerous weapon to commit an act of violence against any students or school employees on school grounds or school property if the threat can be reasonably interpreted to be harmful or adverse to human life, or dangerous to human life.

Sentence: guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.

This section does not prohibit a person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law arising out of the same transaction as the violation of this section.

#### As used in this section:

- "Adverse to human life" means that which causes a substantial likelihood of death or serious injury.
- "Dangerous weapon" means a knife, stabbing instrument, brass knuckles, blackjack, club, or other object specifically designed or customarily carried or possessed for use as a weapon.
- "School" means a public, private, denominational, or parochial school offering developmental kindergarten, kindergarten, or any grade from 1 through 12.
- "School property" means a building, playing field, or property used for school purposes to impart instruction to children or used for functions and events sponsored by a school, except a building used primarily for adult education or college extension courses.

A Tribal Resolution documenting participation in the needs assessment, a count of Elders, interviewers or volunteers to conduct the survey, interpretation of the results with local input, development of recommendations for actions, dissemination of the results to tribal leaders and health officials; and

WHEREAS, Summary information from needs assessment along with a national comparison report will be returned to the governing council and to the local contact person; and

WHEREAS, Data sovereignty, confidentiality, and safeguarding is of utmost importance; therefore, the information is collected anonymously, data is stored on a secure server for the life of the NRCNAA, and physical copies of the needs assessments will be stored within a locked storage cabinet at the University of North Dakota (UND) School of Medicine & Health Sciences for a period of ten years as outlined in the UND's Records and Retention Schedule.

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## ENGAGING WILMER CUTLER PICKERING HALE AND DORR LLP FOR SUPREME COURT PETITION

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 467 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the tribe's Board of Directors is concerned the recently imposed 2023 Great Lakes Fishing Decree fails to offer adequate protections for the ability of tribal members to exercise their treaty rights by the placing of significant restrictions on the right to commercially fish; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 Great Lakes Fishing Decree was finalized after the other tribes, the state of Michigan and the United States of America purposefully excluded the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians from negotiations and after the District Court erred in denying the due process of a full evidentiary hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals decision to deny the Sault St. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians' appeal has allowed the parties, to *United States v. Michigan*, and the District Court, to dispose of a necessary party in negotiations and collectively agree to restrict Sault St. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians' treaty rights without proper due process; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is highly concerned with the implications for all sovereign tribal nations if the United States Supreme Court does not have an opportunity to review the Sixth Circuit Appeals decision; and

WHEREAS the most concerning implication is the new reality that tribal, state and Federal government representatives can collude to deprive a sovereign tribal nation of its inherent right to actively participate in the negotiation and full adjudication of a treaty right; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors wishes to partner with the established and accomplished Unites States Supreme Court practitioners of Wilmer Cutler Pickering Hale and Dorr LLP (WilmerHale) in a petition for certiorari to the United States Supreme Court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors hereby approves the contract between the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians and the law firm of WilmerHale for the purposes of providing legal assistance in the handling of a certiorari petition to the United States Supreme Court regarding the tribe's treaty rights in the matter of *United States v. Michigan*.
