ASSIGNING CHI MUKWA COMMUNITY CENTER TO SAULT TRIBE HEALTH DIVISION

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors continually analyzes tribal budgets to ensure the tribe's needs are being met as fiscally responsible as possible; and

WHEREAS, there is general agreement that in order to maintain current budget levels for next year and future years the tribal government needs to find additional sources of revenues to fund its needs, particularly those programs greatly reliant on Tribal Tax Revenues; and

WHEREAS, Chi Mukwa is operated as a community service focused on wellness and recreation and as such intentionally does not generate a profit and relies heavily on tribal tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors desires to identify a way to lessen the financial burden Chi Mukwa imposes on Tribal Tax Revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Sault Tribe Health Division is in a strong financial position; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors finds the wellness and recreation community services provided by Chi Mukwa to be congruent within the goals and allowable expenditures of the Sault Tribe Health Division.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that tribal administration and Sault Tribe Health Division are directed to create and implement a mechanism whereby the Sault Tribe Health Division shall: (a) fund the operation of Chi Mukwa; and (b) execute an agreement with tribal administration whereunder tribal administration shall manage Chi Mukwa on behalf of the Sault Tribe Health Division.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors authorizes the administrative budget modification to the FY 2023 budgets to include all necessary and appropriate actions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors authorizes tribal administration and Sault Tribe Health Division to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the forgoing.

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2023 MISSING AND MURDERED INDIGENOUS RELATIVES DAY OF AWARENESS

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C 467 et seq; and

WHEREAS, since 1492, Indigenous peoples have been stereotyped, displaced, and erased due to simultaneous acts of forced colonization and systemic assimilation. Furthermore, the landmark Supreme Court decision Oliphant V. Suquamish Indian Tribe impacted the jurisdictional powers of Sovereign Tribal Nations since 1978. In part, this trifecta connects directly to the high rates of violence, poverty, homelessness, addiction, mental health, PTSD, and shortened life expectancy for our Indigenous relatives. These risk factors all intersect with the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives epidemic.

WHEREAS, 84.3% of Native American and Alaskan Native Women will be victimized by a violent crime in their lifetime. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has reported that murder is the third-leading cause of death among American Indian and Alaska Native women and that rates of violence on reservations can be up to ten times higher than the national average. WHEREAS, 81.6% of Native American and Alaskan Native Men will be victimized by a violent crime in their lifetime. (André B. Rosay, "Violence Against American Indian and Alaska Native Women and Men," June 1, 2016, nij.ojp.gov: https://nij.ojp.gov/topics/articles/violence-against-american-indian-and-alaska-native-women-and-men)

WHEREAS, though it is difficult to capture accurate statistics of violent crimes committed against our 2Spirit+ relatives, we do know that 43.8% of lesbian women and 61.1% of bisexual women have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner at some point in their lifetime, as opposed to 35% of heterosexual women. 26% of gay men and 37.3% of bisexual men have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime, in comparison to 29% of heterosexual men. Transgender victims are more likely to experience intimate partner violence in public compared to those who do not identify as transgender. LGBTQ victims on public assistance are more likely to experience intimate partner violence compared to those who are not on public assistance. (Source: NCADV.org)

WHEREAS, The Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians implemented the MMIP Tribal Community Response Plan in May 2021. The plan addresses four integrant pieces to coordinate an appropriate response when an Indigenous person goes missing within our tribal boundaries. The plan was created to be empowering to the victim(s) while being culturally honoring and trauma-informed on how to proceed if an MMIR case develops in our community.

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians approved amendments to Tribal Code Chapter 70: Criminal Procedure and Tribal Code Chapter 71: Criminal Offences to implement the expanded terms of the Violence Against Women Act on September 27, 2022. This includes expanding the special criminal domestic violence jurisdiction of Tribal courts to cover non-Native perpetrators of sexual assault, child abuse, stalking, sex trafficking, and assaults on tribal law enforcement officers on tribal lands. The epidemic of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives is exacerbated by all of these major crimes.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, As Anishinabek people, we know that all life is sacred. The Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors honor and recognize the importance of protecting and supporting ALL of our relatives impacted by the epidemic of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians hereby designates May 05, 2023, as a Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Relatives throughout our Tribal Nation.

ROUNDABOUT STATUE

WHEREAS, the city of Sault Ste. Marie is placing a bronze statue of a French Fur Trader at the roundabout where the I-75 Business Spur intersects with Three Mile Road and Mackinac Trail to commemorate the city's French fur trading history.

WHEREAS, the city of Sault Ste. Marie reached out to the Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians and the Bay Mills Indian Community to invite them to place a bronze statue of a Native American at this location to honor the city's Native American history.

WHEREAS, this bronze statue is estimated to cost \$80,000 with the Bay Mills Indian Community agreeing to pay for half.

WHEREAS, each hotel guest that stays at a Kewadin property pays a 5% cultural enhancement tax, which is evenly distributed among the five units, with each unit receiving 1% of these funds.

WHEREAS, there is an abundance of cultural enhancement funds, and financing this project falls under the scope of why this fund was originally created.

WHEREAS, the Sault Tribe of Chippewa Indians and Bay Mills Indian Community will each select two community members to assist the statue's artist in ensuring that the project will remain culturally appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors will utilize an equal portion of cultural enhancement funds from each unit (\$8,000 per unit) to purchase this statue (\$40,000) to honor our Tribe's history.

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LIMITED WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY AND CONSENT TO WAIVER OF TRIBAL COURT JURISDICTION AMERICAN RURAL COOPERATIVE POWER, INC.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians ("Board" and "Tribe"), as follows:

Section 1 APPROVALS AND AUTHORIZATION

- 1.1 The Board authorizes and directs the Tribe, through its Chairman and attorneys, on such conditions and terms as they deem fit, to enter into the Membership Agreement and Term Sheet for ARC Membership ("Agreements") with American Rural Cooperative Power, Inc. ("ARC") on such terms as they may agree upon.
- 1.2 The Chairman and attorneys are authorized and directed to execute and deliver such other certificates, documents, or instruments, as may be required or to take any and all such action which may be necessary or convenient to effectuate the Agreements consistent with this Resolution.
- Section 2 LIMITED WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY AND CONSENT TO JURISDICTION.
- 2.1 The Tribe hereby grants a limited waiver of sovereign immunity from suit in favor of ARC only should an action be commenced to enforce the Agreements.

This waiver:

- i) shall terminate upon performance by the Authority of all of its obligations under the Agreements,
- ii) is granted solely to ARC;
- iii) shall extend to inter alia, any judicial or non-judicial action, including, but not limited to, any lawsuit, arbitration, and judicial or non-judicial action to resolve disputes between the Authority and the ARC to enforce the obligations under the Agreements;
- iv) shall be enforceable only in the state courts of Chippewa County, Michigan and any court from which an appeal may be taken from that court; and
- v) shall be enforceable against all assets of the Tribe to the extent necessary to satisfy the Authority's obligation under the Agreements.
