RESOLUTION NO: 3005 - 133 CONSERVATION COMMITTEE APPLICATION OF 26 U.S.C. 7873

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indians Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the right to fish commercially and for subsistence by the members of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians was reserved and guaranteed in the Treaty of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491); and

WHEREAS, the right to fish in the waters of the Great Lakes ceded pursuant to the 1836 Treaty was confirmed by the Michigan Supreme Court in <u>People v. LeBlanc</u>, 399 Mich. 31, 248 N.W. 2d 199 (1976) and by the federal courts in <u>U.S. v. Mich.</u>, 471 F. Supp. 192 (W. D. Mich. 1979), aff'd 653 F. 2d 277 (6th Cir. 1981), cert. denied, 454 U.S. 1124 (1981); and

WHEREAS, tribal self-regulation of treaty fishing activity is recognized as an integral element of the rights reserved by treaty, by the courts and by the United States in its role as trustee; and

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians established in December 1978 the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Conservation Committee; and

WHEREAS, it has been the consistent position of the Tribe that the Conservation Committee is essential and integral to the perpetuation of the tribal fishery; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe recognizes that the Chairperson of the Conservation Committee devotes a significant percentage of his time to leading the efforts of the Conservation Committee and in the performance of the duties as Chairperson of the Conservation Committee in its role of protecting and exercising treaty fishing rights through, among other things: (1) representation of the Tribe in the Board of Directors of the Chippewa-Ottawa Resource Authority; (2) development of tribal management decisions for the fishery; (3) development of tribal positions in the ongoing U.S. v. Mich. litigation; and (4) development of markets for treaty fish.

WHEREAS, the Tribe also recognizes that other Board of Directors members may also sit on the Conservation Committee and devote more of their time to the above mentioned issues.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the accounting and personnel departments for the Tribe are directed to allocate and account for a thirty percent (30%) time expenditure for the Chairperson of the Conservation Committee and an additional percentage (2.5%), for a total of twenty percent (20%) for Board Members who also sit on the Conservation Committee, for the purpose calculating the 26 U.S.C. 7873 exemption for federal and state income tax.

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (the "Tribe") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 467 et seq; and

Economic Development Commission WHEREAS, the Tribe is the owner of land held in trust by the federal government within the city limits of the City of St. Ignace (the "Trust Land"); and

WHEREAS, the Tribe owns housing units located on the Trust Land that is maintained using federal funds in accordance with the Native American Housing

Assistance and Self Determination Act of 1996 ("NAHASDA"); and WHEREAS, NAHASDA requires tribes to enter into agreements for cooperation with local units of government and the payments in lieu of taxes to qualify for funding for

WHEREAS, the Tribe has negotiated an agreement for payment in lieu of taxes with the City of St. Ignace.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors approves the attached agreement with the City of St. Ignace for payments in lieu of taxes, subject to formal approval by the City of St. Ignace.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairperson, or his designee, is authorized and directed to execute and deliver such other agreements, certificates, documents, or instruments, as may be required or take any and all such action which may be necessary to execute the foregoing.

I. Purpose and Intent

- 1. The purpose and intent of the parties to this Agreement is:
 - a. To provide for cooperation between the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (the "Tribe") and the City of St. Ignace, Michigan (the "City") in connection with the delivery of public services to the Tribe's trust land located in the City (the "Trust Land").
 - b. To provide for payments in lieu of taxes by the Tribe to the City as compensation for services provided for the benefit of the Trust Land and its residents within the City.

II. Parties

This Agreement is entered into between the Tribe, a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. Sec. 476, and the City, a municipal corporation of the State of Michigan.

III. Payment in Lieu of Taxes

- 1. The Tribe agrees to make payments to the City general fund each year as follows:
 - a. A payment in the amount equal to the amount prescribed by regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development for federally assisted housing for each housing unit located on Trust Land as such regulations may be amended from time to time.
 - b. The Tribe will not make payments in lieu of taxes for property which is utilized for essential governmental functions (within the meaning of the Indian Tribal Governmental Tax Status Act 26 U.S.C. 71(e)).
 - c. The payments described in this Section III shall be made in one annual payment made on or before May 30th of each year.

- d. The Tribe shall provide for the filing of an affidavit of transfer with the City Assessor, whenever an assignment or transfer of Trust Land occurs.
- e. In the event that the Tribe disagrees with any payment required under Section III, it may appeal to the City Board of Review, which shall hear and decide the matter as part of its review of tax assessments under the state statute. The decision of the Board of Review shall be subject to appeal pursuant to Section VI hereof.

IV. Public/Utility Service

The parties agree that the PILT provided for in this Agreement compensates the City for the cost of the services normally provided to City residents and to properties within the City without additional charges. The City agrees to provide such services to the Trust Land without additional charge, except for City owned, or managed services (water, sewer, garbage collection) which will be charged directly to each resident at the same rate as other structures receiving the same services according to City of St. Ignace Sewer and Water Rate Ordinances ("Service Payments"). It is understood that collection of delinquent Service Payments will be in accordance with the above referenced ordinances. The Tribe shall guarantee payment of such Service Payments.

V. Specific Project Funding

The Parties may, from time to time, enter into specific undertakings for projects or services to be provided by the City and funded in full or in part by the Tribe under this Agreement. Funding for such undertakings shall be in addition to the PILT described above. Such undertakings shall be set forth in written summaries specifically describing the project or service to be provided, the amount of funding to be provided by the Tribe, and approved and executed by both Parties.

VI. Consultation Between Parties

- 1. A committee to be known as Tribal Liaison Committee is hereby established, consisting of the Mayor, two appointed Council Members of the City of St. Ignace, the Chairman of the Triba and/or designee and two persons appointed by the Tribal Board of Directors. The Tribal Liaison Committee shall:
 - a. Review any proposals for joint Tribal-City projects to be funded under Section V, and make recommendations to the parties;
 - b. Review any issue raised by either the City or the Tribe regarding implementation of this Agreement and make recommendations to

the parties relating thereto. The parties agree to convene a meeting of the committee within 10 days of receipt of written request by either party;

- c. Review and decide any appeal of the City Board of Review decision on a payment assessed pursuant to Section III. The decision of the Tribal Liaison Committee regarding such appeal shall be final.
- d. Consider any other matters which the parties may refer to it from time to time.

VII. Authority to Enter

The Tribe hereby grants to the City's employees, the Building Inspector, City of St. Ignace Assessor, the City Fire Chief, City Police Department through its mutual aid with the Tribe and the State Marshall, its permission to enter onto the Trust Land for purpose of carrying out their official responsibilities in accordance with this Agreement, subject to the rights of individual occupants of the Trust Land.

VIII. Trust Land Use Restrictions

The Tribe agrees to subject the Trust Land to the following City Ordinances, except to the extent such City Ordinances may restrict or conflict with Tribal governmental operations:

- a. #366 Disorderly Persons
- b. #377 Weed Control
- c. #410 Nuisance Ordinance
- d. #421 Burning Ordinance
- e. #422 Street Excavation
- f. #424 Snow Removal Ordinance
- g. #427 Construction Code Act; Enforcing Agency
- h. #437 Parental Responsibility
- i. #439 Garbage & Refuse Collection Disposal
- i. #461 Uniform Traffic Code
- k. #464 Curfew Ordinance
- 1. #492 Animal Control Ordinance
- m. #513 Tree Ordinance
- n. #529 Dangerous Building Ordinance
- o. #538 Noise Emissions & Noise Creation
- p. #542 Adult Bookstores, Adult Theatres, Live Entertainment and Cabarets
- q. #554 Blight Ordinance
- r. #600 Zoning Ordinance

Any other adopted Ordinances by the City subject to mutual approval by both parties as per Article VI of this agreement.

IX. Federally Assisted Housing

The parties recognize that federally assisted housing operated by the Tribal Housing Authority is governed by federal regulations regarding cooperation with local units of government and payments in lieu of taxes. The City agrees to accept the payment in lieu of taxes prescribed by regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, to facilitate the development of federally assisted housing on the Trust Land.

X. Non-Applicability to Taxable Property

In the event that any improvements or leasehold interest relating to any portion of the Tribe's Trust Land is determined to be subject to taxation as determined by the Federal Government, then the provision of this agreement relating to payments in lieu of taxes shall no longer pertain to such taxable property.

XI. Term

This Agreement becomes effective when the United States of America accepts a parcel of land located within the City in trust for the Tribe. The payment provided for in Section III shall apply to the first tax year following trust status.

The term of this Agreement shall be two (2) years. It shall renew for additional terms of two (2) years automatically unless either party gives sixty (60) days written notice of its intent to renegotiate the agreement.
