WHEREAS, becoming a Live Scan Agency to access to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System maintained by the Department of State Police that is the computerized system for encoding, searching and matching fingerprints automatically, which includes the storage and retrieval of fingerprint images, would aid the Sault Ste. AMENDING TRIBAL CODE CHAPTER 71: CRIMINAL OFFENSES

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 467 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has enacted Tribal Code Chapter 71: Criminal Offenses pursuant to Article IV of the Tribal Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors would like to amend Tribal Code Chapter 71 as currently written.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors amends Section 71.1202 of Chapter 71: Criminal Offenses as follows:

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71.1202 Disorderly Conduct.

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(1) Offense. A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct, if the person intentionally, knowingly or recklessly:

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(a) uses abusive, indecent, profane, or vulgar language in a public or private place which by its very utterance tends to incite violence, unlawful conduct, or a breach of the peace by others; or

Government Services (b) makes an offensive gesture or display in a public or private place which by its very nature tends to incite violence, unlawful conduct, or a breach of the peace by others; or

- (c) abuses or threatens a person in a public or private place in a manner calculated to place the threatened person in fear of bodily harm; or
- (d) makes unreasonable noise in a public place, or on or near private property that he has no right to occupy; or
- (e) fights with another in a public or private place; or
- (f) displays a deadly weapon in a public or private place in a manner calculated to alarm; or
- (g) discharges a firearm in a public or private place; or
- (h) disrupts any lawful public or religious meeting or assembly; or
- (i) lies or sleeps on any public street, alley or private property that he has no right to occupy; or
- (j) urinates or defecates in any public place, except where an approved sanitary facility is provided, or in public view: or

- (k) obstructs any highway or other public passage, whether alone or with others; or
- (1) refuses to obey a reasonable request issued by a person the actor knows to be or is informed is a law enforcement officer, a fireman, or a person with authority to control the use of the premises in order to prevent obstruction of a highway or other public passage or in order to maintain public safety by dispersing those gathered in dangerous proximity to a fire or other hazard.
- (2) Sentence, A person convicted of disorderly conduct may be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not to exceed three (3) months, or a fine not to exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), or both.

(3) Comment.

- (a) As used in subsections 1(k) and 1(l), "obstructs" means render impassable without unreasonable inconvenience or hazard.
- (b) No person shall be deemed guilty of an offense under subsection 1(k) solely because of a gathering of persons to hear him speak or otherwise communicate, or solely because of being a member of such a gathering.
- (c) For purposes of subsection 1(l), an order to move, addressed to a person whose speech or other lawful behavior attracts an obstructing audience, shall not be deemed reasonable if the obstruction can be readily remedied by police control of the size or location of the gathering.

AMENDING TRIBAL CODE CHAPTER 76

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 467 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has previously enacted Tribal Code Chapter 76: Gaween-Nji-Da pursuant to Article VII of the Tribal Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has identified a deficiency in Tribal Code Chapter 76 as it is currently written.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors amends Tribal Code, Chapter 76, Partial Waiver of Conviction for Gaming License Purposes so that the current language set forth in Section 76.105(b) "the individual has not been convicted of or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to misdemeanor fraud or misrepresentation more than two (2) times" shall be deleted and the subsections re-numbered so that Section 76.105 in its entirety will be as follows:

76.105 Eligibility for Waiver.

- (1) Any Tribal member who has been convicted of a crime within the immediately preceding five (5) years is eligible for a waiver only if all of the following conditions are met:
 - (a) the individual has never been convicted of or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to felony fraud, felony misrepresentation or any gamblingrelated offense;
 - (b) the individual has never participated in organized crime;
 - (c) the individual has not been denied a waiver nor had a waiver application dismissed for failure to disclose all criminal convictions within the preceding three (3) months; and
 - (d) the individual does not have more than three (3) criminal convictions resulting from separate instances of conduct within the preceding two (2) years.
- (2) The Gaming Commission and the Tribal Prosecutor shall not process any application for a waiver filed by an individual who is determined to be ineligible pursuant to Section 105(1) above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors amends Tribal Code, Chapter 76, Partial Waiver of Conviction for Gaming License Purposes so that Section 76.108 will now appear as follows:

76.108 Standards for Granting a Waiver.

- (1) The Board of Directors shall grant a waiver to an eligible applicant who only upon a finding that:
 - (a) the applicant is not likely again to engage in any offensive or criminal course of conduct;
 - (b) the public good does not require that the applicant be denied a license as a key employee or primary management official; and
 - (c) the applicant's prior activities, criminal record, associations, and/or background do not pose a threat to the public interest, gaming regulation, or the Tribe's business and financial arrangements incidental to gaming.
- (2) If an applicant has been convicted of or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to misdemeanor fraud or misrepresentation more than two (2) times in the preceding two (2) years, that person shall be presumed not to meet the standards set forth in subsection (1) above. However, at the waiver hearing, such applicant shall be provided an opportunity to overcome that presumption with evidence establishing that the applicant has been rehabilitated.
