# U. S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) FY 2008 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM FOR INDIAN TRIBES AND ALASKA NATIVE VILLAGES

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Membership Services WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has solicited a funding opportunity (FR-5200-N-12) for the Community Development Block Grant Program for Indian Tribes and Alaska Native Villages (ICDBG); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Community Development Block Grant Program for Indian Tribes and Alaska Native Villages (ICDBG), is the development-of viable Indian and Alaska Native communities, including the creation of decent housing, suitable living environments, and economic opportunities primarily for persons with low and moderate incomes; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is seeking to improve its 1937 housing stock in Sault Ste. Marie, MI through replacement of windows and boilers for 55 homes located within Projects 001-003; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority requires additional funding to replace existing (outdated) windows and boilers in Sault Ste. Marie, MI units with energy efficient, energy star products; it is recommended that a grant be submitted by the Housing Authority to procure \$400,000 to better serve Tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is seeking to upgrade the water main system at the St. Ignace, MI housing site; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is seeking to use \$200,000 of ICDBG funds to match a USDA, Rural Development grant for the remaining \$600,000 needed to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, the St. Ignace water upgrade project would provide our Tribal Members with higher quality water, along with fire protection.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sault Tribe Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Sault Tribe Housing Authority or its duly authorized representative, to submit an application requesting \$600,000 for the FY 2008 Community Development Block Grant Program for Indian Tribes and Alaska Native Villages (ICDBG), administered by the Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) to replace windows and boilers with energy star, energy efficient products in Sault Ste. Marie, MI. to improve living conditions and cost savings for Tribal resident and upgrade the water main system at the St. Ignace, MI housing site to provide higher quality water and fire protection.
