The Advisory Committee will be responsible for providing the Board of Directors with timely information about all activities and decisions made by the Advisory Committee.

COMPOSITION: The Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, by resolution, puts in place the Head Start Advisory Committee. Membership to be comprised of four persons, two of whom shall be sitting members of this Board of Directors, and these members shall be selected by this Board of Directors, to serve until removed or replaced by this Board; and

BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESPONSIBLITIES:

- 1. All legal and fiscal responsibilities that ensure compliance with applicable Federal, State and Tribal Law, including the safeguarding of federal funds
- 2. Develop practices that will assure resolution of internal disputes that will facilitate meaningful consultation and collaboration about the decisions of the Board of Directors, the Advisory Committee, and the Policy Council
- Approve all applications for Head Start funding and amendment to such applications
- 4. Selecting delegate agencies and their service areas, as appropriate
- 5. Approve Personnel policies regarding hiring, evaluations, termination and compensation of the Executive Director, Head Start Director, Director of Human Resources, Chief Financial Officer; and any other person in an equivalent position within the Tribe
- 6. Approve financial management, accounting, and reporting policies
- 7. Annual approval of the operating budget
- 8. Selection of independent financial auditors who shall report all critical accounting policies and practices to the Board of Directors
- Monitor actions to correct any audit findings and of other actions necessary to comply with applicable laws and regulations governing financial statements and accounting practices
- 10. Establishing, adopting, and periodically updating writing standards of conduct that establish standards and formal procedures for disclosing, addressing, and resolving any conflicts of interest or appearance of conflicts of interest by Directors, Officers, and employees of the corporation, and consultants and agents who provide services or furnish goods to the corporation; and complaints, including investigations, as appropriate

ADVISORY COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Approve procedures and criteria for recruitment, selection, and enrollment of children
- 2. Review all applications for Head Start funding and amendment to such applications.
- 3. Approve all applications prior to submission to the Board of Directors for final approval.
- 4. Approve procedures and guidelines for accessing and collecting accurate and regular information for use by the Board of Directors and the Policy Council about program planning, policies, and Head Start agency operations;
- 5. Review and approve all major policies of the Head Start program, including but not limited to:
 - The annual self-assessment
 - The Community Assessment
 - Financial audit
 - Review the programs progress in carrying out the programmatic and fiscal provisions in the Head Start applications, including implementing any corrective actions, as applicable
 - Approving procedures for how members of the Policy Council are selected
 - Monitor and review monthly financial statements, including the approval of all major financial expenditures
 - Monitoring the programs actions to correct any audit findings and report to the Board of Directors the progress of the programs actions
 - Reviewing results from monitoring conducted under section 641A(c) of the Head Start Act, including appropriate follow up activities;
- 6. The Advisory Committee will meet on a monthly basis and the minutes from each meeting will be sent to the Board of Directors by the Committee
- 7. Committee members will be available to answer any and all questions that are presented by the Board of Directors

"No Tribal member shall gather plant materials <u>or other natural resources</u> on State lands for personal, cultural or traditional craft use, except as allowed herein or in Section 21.1503."

3. 21.1503 Personal and Commercial Use is amended at section (c) (3) to read:

"The use of plants $\underline{and\ other\ natural\ resources}$ for the manufacture and sale of handicraft products."

4. 21.1503 Personal and Commercial Use is amended at section (4) to read:

"Tribal members may sell furbearers, flesh and hides, and parts of harvested animals for manufacture and sale of handicraft products."

21.1803 <u>Vehicle Registration</u> is created to read:

"Tribal members using an all terrain vehicle, a boat, a utility terrain vehicle or a snow machine in furtherance of an activity permitted, licensed or allowed pursuant to this Chapter shall have on their person a valid Tribal permit or license for the activity they are engaged in at that point in time and for an activity allowed to be undertaken without a permit or license a Tribal membership identification. The permit, license or Tribal membership identification shall serve as the Tribal registration of that vehicle for the limited purpose of the given all terrain vehicle, boat, utility terrain vehicle or snow machine's use in the permitted, licensed or allowed activity.
