OPTIONS AND PRE-APPROVAL FOR STOCKING SURPLUS WALLEYE FINGERLINGS

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians administers a biological fisheries program, the Inter-tribal Fisheries and Assessment Program (ITFAP), which operates a walleye culture and stocking activity; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 2000 or 2007 Consent Decrees, the Tribes do not have authority to stock fish in inland waters (or Bay de Noc) unless agreed to by the State of Michigan; and

WHEREAS, in some years, ITFAP has produce fingerling walleye in excess of its Great Lakes stocking targets, and offered these surplus fish to MDNR for stocking in Inland lakes and Bay de Noc - but not until after a rapid and confusing decision and approval process among MDNR, ITFAP and the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, prolonging decisions on where to stock surplus walleye fingerlings as they are being removed from the rearing ponds will result in high mortality of these fish, which could be avoided by adopting a pre-determined stocking plan and associated authorizations; and

WHEREAS, ITFAP and MDNR biologists recently agreed to a stocking plan for ITFAP's surplus walleye fingerlings, which identifies potential Inland lakes (and Bay de Noc) that are, 1) used by Sault Tribe members for subsistence and/or recreational fishing, and 2) consistent with MDNR's stocking plans for walleye;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians supports the tribal/state biologists' recommendation for stocking ITFAP's surplus walleye fingerlings, and authorizes the ITFAP to decide which of the recommended sites to stock on an annual basis.

- Sign any correspondence to a third party that would normally and for good cause require the signature of the Chairperson.
- Perform any and all duties delegated to, authorized to be performed or (d) directed to be performed by the Chairperson in a previously adopted resolution.
- (e) Perform any and all duties delegated to, authorized to be performed or directed to be performed by the Chairperson in the various Team Member Manuals.
- In furtherance of and in further explanation of the above, execute all (f) documents that require the Chairperson's signature due to administrative staff's spending limits signature authority, as indicated on the attached signature authority matrix.
- Perform all administrative functions required to be performed pursuant to the June 9, 2009, organizational chart.
