In doing so, the agency essentially asks the tribe to fulfill the role of a consultant or contractor. In such cases, the tribe would be justified in requiring payment for its services, just as any other contractor. The agency or applicant is free to refuse, but retains the obligation for obtaining the necessary information for the identification of historic properties, the evaluation of their National Register eligibility, and the assessment of effects on the historic properties; and
