REAFFIRMATION OF SAULT TRIBE CORPORATE CHARTER AND APPOINTING INITIAL CORPORATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians Board of Directors seeks to ensure the Tribes ability to pursue Economic Diversification including 8(a) and Government contracting opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1(m) of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians authorizes the Board of Directors "[t]o manage any and all economic affairs and enterprises of the tribe and to engage in any business not contrary to Federal law that will further the economic development of the tribe or its members"; and

WHEREAS, Article VI, Section 1(n) of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians further authorizes the Board of Directors "[t]o establish and delegate to subordinate boards, organizations, cooperative associations, tribal officers, committees, delegates or other tribal groups, any of the foregoing powers, reserving the right to review any action taken by virtue of such delegated power or to cancel any delegation"; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, as amended, authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to issue a charter of incorporation upon the petition by any Tribe; and

WHEREAS, by motion on 6-8-2010 the Board of Directors directed communication to the Secretary of the Interior verifying approval of the Corporate Charter in its current form; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2009-181 the Board of Directors petitioned the Secretary of the Interior to issue a federal corporate charter to the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, to be known as the Sault Tribe Incorporated, and having all the powers, privileges and immunities enumerated by its charter and by applicable law; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated July 1, 2010, Diane K. Rosen, then Regional Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs formally approved the Sault Tribe Corporate Charter "to become effective upon ratification by the Sault Ste. Marie Board of Directors"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI of the Sault Tribe Corporate Charter the business and affairs of the Corporation are to be managed by a Corporate Board of Directors comprised of five members appointed by the Tribal Board of Directors, meeting the qualifications specified in the Charter, and may also include two members of the tribal Board of Directors who serve at the pleasure of the Tribal Board of Directors as non-voting, ex-officio observers spokespersons, on the Corporate Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has concluded that it is in the best interests of the Tribe to ratify and implement the Sault Tribe Corporate Charter and to appoint its initial Corporate Board of Directors.

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Indian Housing Block Grant Program – Competitive Grants (IHBG-C), is the development of viable Indian and Alaska Native communities, including the creation of decent housing, suitable living environments, and economic opportunities primarily for persons with low and moderate incomes; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority is seeking approval to apply for up to \$5,000,000 of IHBG-C funds on behalf of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians; and

WHEREAS, the competitive funding will provide a minimum of 30 additional rental units for low to moderate income tribal families in accordance with the established Odenaang Development Plan.

Michigan

21.524 Shotgun Zone. Limited Firearm Deer Zone

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All deer hunters in the shotgun zone <u>Limited Firearm Deer Zone</u> from November 15 to November 30, and all deer hunters in the shotgun zone <u>Limited Firearm Deer Zone</u> during other deer seasons shall abide by the following restrictions or use a bow or cross bow:

(1) A shotgun may have a smooth or rifled barrel and may be of any gauge.

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(2) A muzzle loading rifle or black powder handgun must be loaded with black powder or a commercially manufactured black powder substitute.

(3) A conventional (smokeless powder) handgun must be .35 caliber or larger and loaded with straight-walled cartridges and may be single or multiple shot but cannot exceed a maximum capacity of nine rounds in the barrel and magazine combined.

(4) .22 caliber or smaller rim fire firearms may be used to kill raccoon while hunting raccoons with dogs between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

- (5) A rifle in the Limited Firearm Deer Zone that is .35 caliber or larger with straight-walled cartridges with a minimum case length of 1.16 inches and a maximum case length of 1.80 inches.
- (6) They may also use a .35 caliber or larger air rifle or pistol charged only from an external high-compression power source.
