ALLOWING FOR IMPROVED PROCESSING OF EXECUTED AND APPROVED TRIBAL EXPENDITURES IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

WHEREAS, the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians (the "Tribe") organized pursuant to the Constitution of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution of the Tribe, the Board of Directors has the power to regulate trade, commerce, and all manner of criminal and non-criminal conduct within the boundaries of its reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is authorized by Article VII Sec. l(n) of the Constitution to delegate certain powers and responsibilities to appropriate subordinate boards, organizations, officer, employees, and directors; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-72 declared a state of emergency on the reservation lands of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, directed the Tribal Government, Casinos, and other tribal departments to coordinate to maximize efforts to resist the spread of COVID-19, and granted to the Executive Director of the Tribe, the Interim CEO of the Casinos, and the Executive Director of the EDC such authority as necessary to temporarily modify policies or procedures as necessary; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2020-117 Established the COVID-19 Taskforce to develop a strategy for utilization of funding received for COVID-19 relief under the CARES Act; and

WHEREAS, the Taskforce is to make recommendations to the Tribal Board of Directors through the Tribal Executive Director, Kewadin Casinos CEO and Tribal EDC Executive Director; and

WHEREAS, that the Board of Directors has determined that the Tribal Chairperson, Tribal Executive Director, Kewadin Casino CEO, and Tribal EDC Executive Director require additional authority to effectively respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and to allow the Tribe to distribute relief funds under the CARES Act in a streamlined and efficient way.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Board of Directors grants to the Tribal Executive Director, Kewadin Casino CEO, and Tribal EDC Executive Director the authority to waive the signature authority policy, budget modification policy, salary and hiring policies, procurement and purchasing policies and other Tribal policies and procedures relating to the disbursement of tribal funds as they determine necessary but only to the extent needed to streamline and expedite the disbursement of CARES Act relief funding that are executed and approved expenditures pursuant to a tribal program and as authorized by US Treasury guidelines and applicable federal law.

Policies and Procedures

- Purpose and Intent. The Sault Ste. Marie Tribe desires to establish a COVID-19
 Enterprise Recovery Program (hereinafter "Program") to provide emergency assistance
 grants to Tribal Owned Businesses to reimburse the costs of business interruption caused
 by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. Finding of Need. The Tribe has determined that this Program and the assistance provided thereunder are necessary to respond to and address the significant and unanticipated financial hardship facing Tribal Enterprises due to the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on the global, national, and local economy.

3. Definitions:

- A. "Disruption Period" means any period beginning on or after March 17, 2020 during which a tribal business was closed to the public, materially suspended operations, or had its operations impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- B. "Lost Revenue" means for the Disruption Period, the estimated adjusted gross revenue that would have been earned during such Disruption Period had no Disruption Period occurred. Calculation of Lost Revenue shall be made in good faith using historical financial performance data, financial projections, operating budgets, and such other information the Tribe deems reliable.
- 4. Eligibility. Any business wholly owned by the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians which can demonstrate lost revenue or other financial impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic is eligible for a grant under this Program (hereinafter "Qualified Business").
- Administration. The Program shall be administered by the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe COVID-19 Taskforce Grants Subcommittee.
- 6. Program Funding. The COVID-19 Enterprise Recovery Program shall be funded from Federal CARES Act Governmental Relief Funds received by the Tribe and allocated through the existing administrative, budgeting, and monitoring processes and policies.

7. Program Procedures.

A. Upon adoption of this Program, Notice shall be given to potentially eligible tribal businesses that provides information regarding the Program and the application process for receiving a grant. Entities wishing to receive an assistance grant under

- this Program must submit the attached Application and shall contain a certification of an authorized officer of such Eligible Business as to the calculation of the amount of Lost Revenue.
- B. Each application shall be accompanied with copies of such documents and records as may be necessary to establish the reasonableness and accuracy of such calculations, and each applicant shall agree to promptly provide such additional records or other information as may be requested by the Tribe to document the amounts requested and the use of any payments under this Program.
- C. A business affected by a Disruption Period shall be eligible for payments in an amount up to the estimated Lost Revenue during the Disruption Period.
- Award Procedures. Awards shall be issued pursuant to the Tribe's COVID-19 Taskforce
 Grants Subcommittee Policies and Procedures for Allocation of CARES Act Tribal
 Governmental Relief Funds.
- 9. Eligible Expenses. Assistance grants awarded under this Program are to be exclusively used to meet necessary and reasonable expenses incurred as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic after March 1, 2020 and which are not otherwise compensated by insurance, other CARES Act funding (including SBA Paycheck Protection Program), or other means. Necessary and reasonable expenses allowable under this program are limited to the following.
 - A. payroll and employee benefits,
 - B. upkeep and maintenance of facilities,
 - C. utilities,
 - D. payment of obligations under contracts entered into prior to March 1, 2020, and
 - E. any additional demonstrated business interruption costs.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is of the opinion that filing an amicus brief in the case of *People of the State of Michigan v. Walter Joseph Caswell* will serve to defend the Tribe's Treaty rights.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors does hereby authorize and direct the drafting and filing of an amicus brief on behalf of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians in the matter of People of the State of Michigan v. Walter Joseph Caswell, COA No. 353537 in the State of Michigan Court of Appeals, by and through the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe's Treaty Fishing Legal Team, Mason Morisset and Lauren King.
