A \$20.00 motion fee is due upon filing the motion except in PPO cases. If you are indigent or on public assistance and cannot afford the motion fee, you may file a separate written request to have the Court waive the filing fee (inquire with the court clerk).

You will be given a copy of this Motion to keep for your own records. The Court will issue a Notice of Hearing and mail a copy to you and the respondent. If you do not appear in Court on the date and time designated on the Notice of Hearing, it is likely that the Court will dismiss the Motion.

The Tribal Court Clerks are not permitted to give legal advice, and are limited as to what questions they may answer. If you have questions of a legal nature, you should contact an attorney. The Tribal Court staff is permitted to provide you with a list of attorneys who often practice before the Tribal Court. Michigan Indian Legal Services (MILS) provides civil and criminal help. If you cannot afford an attorney you may want to reach out to MILS at 231.947.0122.

If you are a defendant in a criminal case, you may file a request for a Court Appointed Attorney. You may be ordered to reimburse the Court for a portion of fees/costs of your Court Appointed Attorney.
